Rabbi Ted Falcon, Ph.D., guides a spiritually-focused community called *Bet Alef Meditative Synagogue*. As a rabbi/therapist, he teaches the universal depths of the Jewish spiritual path and celebrates the Oneness at the Heart of all authentic spiritual traditions. Rabbi Ted shares the evolution of his work in an evolving process called "Practical Spirituality" blending spirituality and psychology to heal both person and planet.



Sheikh Jamal Rahman, is the Muslim Sufi Minister at the Interfaith Community Church, an adjunct faculty member at Seattle University and he was co-host of Interfaith Talk Radio with Pastor Don and Rabbi Ted. He is the author of "The Fragrance of Faith-The Enlightened Heart of Islam." Jamal has a passion for Interfaith work. He believes that Interfaith is not about conversion but about completion.



The Rev. Catherine Fransson brings to her preaching and spiritual direction life-long faith and a commitment to empower others. Her ministry encompasses spiritual direction, preaching, retreat leadership, labyrinth, and collegial leadership of Seattle First Baptist Church. She is a fellow in the College of Pastoral Leaders (2009-2011) at Austin Theological Seminary and teaches Pastoral Care at the School of Theology and Ministry at Seattle University.



Pastor Don Mackenzie, is a graduate of Macalester College in Saint Paul, Princeton Theological Seminary, and received his Ph.D. from New York University. Pastor Don has been working collaboratively with Rabbi Ted and Sheikh Jamal on interfaith social action issues since 2001. He is co-founder of the Seattle Network for Peace and Justice in the Middle East. Don retired in June of 2008 as minister and head of staff at University Congregational United Church of Christ in Seattle.
